VOTER-APPROVED FUNDS TRANSFORM LEARNING AT DESERT SKY MIDDLE SCHOOL

Thanks to our voters who passed a 2013 Bond, \$158.3 million was authorized for modernization and upgrade projects at Deer Valley Unified school sites through the year 2020, including a recent \$8.5 Million Modernization Project at Desert Sky Middle School.

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


